Definition of an Employable Driver

(Points 1 – 5 before training, 6 – 20 after training.)

- 1. Relevant level of literacy and numeracy (Level 2).
- 2. Awareness and achievement of a level of personal appearance and hygiene which is acceptable to the employer.
- 3. Recognition of the importance of reliability and punctuality in a driver's role.
- 4. A level of communication skills which is acceptable to the employer.
- 5. A driving licence with a maximum of 6 penalty points.
- 6. An understanding of the importance of documented records of drivers' activities and a willingness to complete such documentation thoroughly and accurately.
- 7. Knowledge of The Highway Code.
- 8. Knowledge of drivers' hours and WTD rules.
- 9. A basic understanding of the operators licencing system and the driver's role in complying.
- 10. The ability to complete a thorough daily walk-round check and take the appropriate action in response to issues arising.
- 11. Safe fuelling of vehicle and safe access and egress to and from vehicles.
- 12. Coupling and uncoupling of units/semi-trailers and rigids/trailers.
- 13. An understanding of the principles of risk assessment and the hazards likely to be encountered in a driver's role.
- 14. An understanding of the principles and practical application of the code of practice on safe loading of vehicles, both at the start of a journey and throughout the journey.
- 15. The ability to monitor and respond to the performance of the vehicle and information from controls and equipment fitted to the vehicle throughout the journey.
- 16. Driving and manoeuvring skills relevant to the class of vehicle to be driven.
- 17. Defensive and fuel-efficient driving skills.
- 18. A sound geographical knowledge relevant to the job being undertaken.
- 19. A realistic understanding of journey times relevant to the vehicle to be driven.
- 20. Understanding the importance of customer service and behaviour on customer premises.
